

#### Suffolk Puffs

Suffolk Puffs, also known as 'Yo-Yos', can be arranged in various ways, to make different shapes. You can use them to embellish a project or even to make an entire quilt!



#### You will need

- Circle template there are two sizes to choose from
- Fabric
- · Hand quilting thread

## Equipment

- Pencil
- Chalk pencil (to use on dark fabric)
- Fabric scissors
- Hand sewing needle

# Preparing the circles

- 1. Choose the size of circle that you want. Remember that the finished Suffolk Puffs will be much smaller than the circle templates.
- 2. Draw round the circle template onto the fabric.
- 3. Use a chalk pencil if you can't see the line from an ordinary pencil.





4. Cut it out using fabric scissors.




- 5. With your fingers, fold in the edge of the circle all round
- 6. Just fold in a little way about  $\frac{1}{2}$  cm.
- 7. Make sure you fold it in over the wrong side of the fabric.
- 8. Squeeze the fold between your fingers, and then move on just a little way round the circle to do the next bit.



### Gathering the circles

- 1. Thread a hand sewing needle with quilting thread.
- 2. Start by making a small knot in the end of the thread.
- 3. Sew around the outside edge of the circles using a running stitch.
- 4. Start so that the knot ends up on top of the folded in edge.
- 5. Take stitches in and out of the fabric, making sure that you go





- through both layers before coming up again.
- 6. Pull the thread right through each time.
- 7. Try to make all your stitches about the same size they don't need to be really tiny for this.
- 8. Stitch right round the circle. When you get back to where you started, go through to the other side.
- 9. *Don't* tie another knot, fasten off or unthread the needle yet!
- 10. Holding the fabric in one hand, pull the thread, so that the fabric starts to wrinkle up. This is called gathering.



- 11. Keep pulling until all the edge of the circle has come together into the middle.
- 12. When you can't pull it any tighter, take several small stitches, all in the same place to fasten off.
- 13. Try not to let the gathering slacken off while you do this!
- 14. Well done you have made your first Suffolk Puff!
