

# Christmas Cards

These Christmas cards were all made using scraps of fabric, along with card and stickers. Once you've learnt the basic technique you can make many different designs.



## Requirements

- Scraps of Christmas fabric
- Bondaweb / Heatnbond or similar
- Blank cards to decorate
- Any other decorations you want to add to your cards – stickers / card scraps / ribbon etc

**\*\* this project involves using the iron – check with an adult before you start**

## Method

- 1 Decide what shapes you want to cut out of your fabric. In the examples above I have used squares and a tree – you can use anything you want. Draw the shapes onto the bondaweb / heatnbond – remember to draw onto the paper side – and cut out roughly.
- 2 Iron the bondaweb / heatnbond shapes onto the wrong side of your Christmas fabrics (it is a good idea to ask an adult for help at this point). Remember to iron with the paper side up.

You can now cut out the shapes on the drawn lines.

- 3 Get your card blank and decide where you want your shapes. Remove the backing paper from the fabric pieces and place them onto the background with the sticky side down (right side of the fabric up) and press. Again, if you are unsure about this, ask an adult for help.
  
- 4 Now you have got your fabric stuck to your card you can decorate it in anyway you want. You could put stickers on, glue on beads or ribbon or draw onto the card to add to your design.
