# own Snazzy Seascape

### You will need:

Scissors and pins

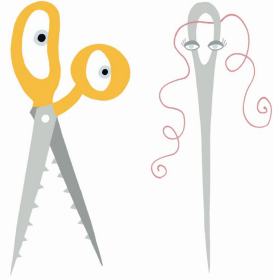
Needle and thread

Fabric glue

Piece of calico for backing (30cm X 30cm approx)

Lots of assorted fabrics- cottons, netting, felt

Ribbon, lace, beads and sequins for decoration



You can either  
sew or use glue  
for this project

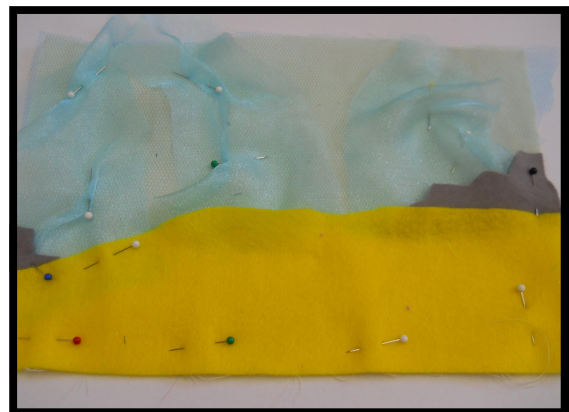
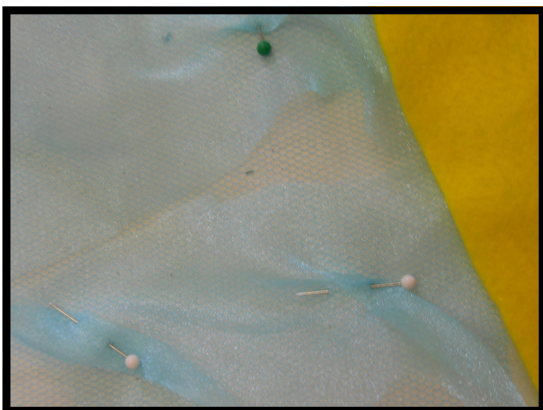


**Tip:** You may wish to design your seascape on paper first and cut out templates.



1. Choose your background fabrics  
and cut them to size.

2. Pin the fabrics to the calico,  
then you can either glue or sew  
the pieces in place.



3. You may like to use netting for the  
sea and create waves by pinning it  
loosely to the calico.

4. Add detail with more layers of  
fabric, e.g. we have added grey  
felt to be cliffs.

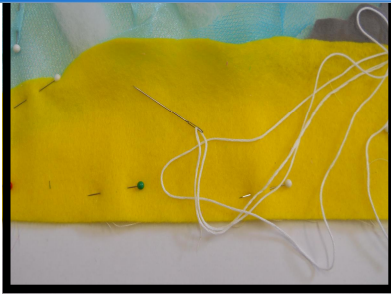

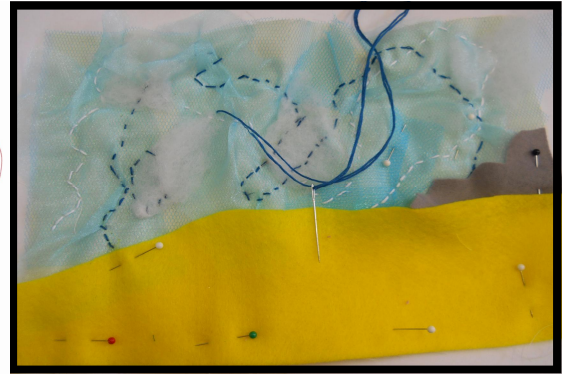

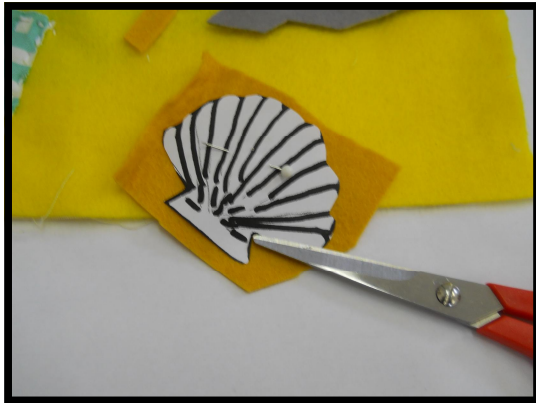

has an umbrella which we made by using a  
paper template to help cut out the shape from  
the fabric.



7. You could add a shell in yellow fabric  
or even a deck chair in stripy fabric.

8. Keep adding detail until you are  
happy with your very own seascape!
